REFLECTION

I thas been a busy start to the year in terms of the Chaplaincy Team. We welcomed Fr Philip Sainter IC, as our new Father President. He has come to us from St Mary's in Loughborough and is now living at the Rosmini Centre House of Prayer with Fr Ted Mullen. We are also joined in the Chaplaincy Team by Mr Clement Donegan, our new Deputy Head in charge of Pastoral matters. Both are offering some fresh eyes to our undertakings, and they are most welcome.



Years 7 and 9 students have both enjoyed encounters with the spiritual life of the College through retreats. Year 7 had a "mini-retreat" at the Rosmini Centre during their first week, and only last Friday spent the whole day learning about the Rosminian Order and the history of the College during the annual Year 7 RS day.

I t involved meditation, team-building, quiet reflective writing and the preparation and celebration of Mass. Growing from this was their presentation on Friday 29th September



of a Chaplaincy Assembly to the Senior School on the Harvest. We were joined for the occasion by Judith Spence of the Carpenter's Arms, who spoke to us about foodbanks.



Year 9 students also led an assembly on Monday 18 September entitled "Choices for Peace", and heralded a Peace Vigil held in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel throughout



the day. Students prepared the assembly themselves, having spent a weekend at the Briars thinking about their choices in life. We were joined on the occasion by representatives of the Nottingham Diocese, in preparation for a Canonical Inspection we are expecting this year. They were impressed by the students' involvement in the assembly, and their discussions with them on the spiritual life of the College.



I t is heartening to see our Chaplaincy Assembly schedule filling fast with studentled reflection and worship. Upcoming assemblies and services will be led by Megha Patel (Year 12), student volunteers who travelled to Lourdes (6th form), and the CCF (for our Remembrance Day Service). We are most appreciative of this generosity and courage (it's not easy for everyone to stand before their peers and speak), and encourage all staff and students to consider leading an assembly.

We were joined again by a diocesan representative on Thursday 28th September in the Boarding House, which is right at the centre of our school community. The Boys' Rooms were blessed for the year by Fr Philip, and Victoria Wheatley of Year 8 led us in night prayer with a song she had prepared. My thanks to the Boarding Staff and students who participated in the visit. The school played host to a gathering of people for a day of workshops and prayer, and a night of praise, worship and adoration to mark the 50th anniversary of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal movement, on the evening of Saturday 16th September.
