The building work on the Fitness Suite continues but the completion date has been pushed back to the end of this term. Work on the Second Sports Hall, weather permitting this winter, is due to be completed by October half-term 2019.

n the staff front, it was lovely to hear of the birth of Mr Thorpe's (Head of Biology and Head of Year 10) third child - a baby boy, and we congratulate Mr Matthews (Peripatetic Music Teacher) on his marriage during the Christmas holidays. I also have pleasure in announcing several new members of staff to the College community to you: Miss Emma Hall takes up post as Resident Lay Chaplain; Miss Sarah Tidy commences in the English Department and she also has responsibility for Public Speaking for the remainder of this year; Mr Chris Bellamy joins us from Pitsford School in Northamptonshire, as our new Bursar; and our new Marketing and Communications Manager, Mr Ian Blackmore-Allen, takes up post on 21st January.

From a Teaching and Learning perspective, this is another extremely busy and important term for all the students. Year 6 children will be taking the Senior School entrance examinations along with external candidates who sit papers this Saturday 12th January and the following Wednesday; Talent Scholarship Assessments for Art & Design, Drama, Music and Sport will take place over the coming weeks; Year 12 will be taking internal assessments on 21st January; and Year 13 are working towards their mock

examinations which commence immediately after February half-term. Year 11 students, with their mocks now completed, will be focused on completing syllabuses by the end of this term and revision. Public examinations will begin earlier this year, and Year 11 and Year 13 students will commence study leave on Friday 10th May due to the longer public examination season.

Thank you for your on-going support of the co-curricular programme. For future reference, please note that all Senior School clubs and societies commence in the first week of every term and continue in the last week of term unless individual staff communicate to the contrary.

The co-curricular programme in the Preparatory School commences in the second week of term and finishes at the end of the penultimate week.

Please can you remind your sons and daughters that all clubs and societies are published on the notice boards and screens around the School, and permission slips must be returned ahead of your sons'/daughters' activities. May I also take this opportunity to request student attendance at sports fixtures and practices as well as other events required by staff.

I look forward to seeing parents of Year 9 students next Tuesday (6.30pm) at the Year 9 GCSE Options Information Evening (Theatre & Rosmini Sixth Form Centre) and please do note the key dates on the School Calendar in your diaries.

December was a busy month with 10 days competing. Here are the highlights. I competed at Cavan Equestrian Centre in Ireland on the weekend of 8th and 9th December. Due to the heavy wind forecasts, we left 12 hours earlier than planned [they will not allow ponies or horses to travel on the ferry in stormy seas). Saturday was a busy day, as my first class was at 8am. I only had one class to have a break throughout the whole day. My last class was at 12pm [midnight]. It was a great weekend and I won 5 classes with numerous other placings.

I qualified to compete at Olympia International in London on 23rd December – one of the best horse shows in the world, with only 12 ponies qualifying to compete in my class. It didn't go as I expected so no rosettes – that's ponies! I qualified 4 ponies to compete at Liverpool International Horse Show on 31st December. Another amazing show and an honour to be there. Placing 5th in the 128 class was only bettered by winning the 138 class on Royal to retain my 2017 International title.

## COMBINED CADET FORCE (CCF)



At 7am on Sunday 9th December, four cadets and myself travelled to Norfolk in order for our cadets to undertake a PTT (Part Task Trainer) course. 614 VGS (Volunteer Gliding Squadron) form part of 2 Flying Training School at Swanton Morley and have the equipment needed in order to do this. This course is both the Ground School and Synthetic Training element (but not the Flying Training element, which we undertake at RAF Cranwell) of the Aviation Training package, and I am pleased to say that Sgt Josh Bellamy, LCpl Max Chapman and LCpl James Wilson all passed, earning themselves both certificates for the Familiarisation Course and their Blue Wings Aviation Package plus badge.

Cdt Steven Lai also passed both sections and once he has undertaken his first flight at RAF Cranwell, this will then earn him his Blue Wings badge. These courses, along with both gliding and powered flight, are highly sought after, and I will be making further bids for more places on these courses for our RAF section.

Unfortunately, due to low cloud base, the RAF Flying at Cranwell had to be cancelled on Thursday; however, we shall be going on Friday 15th February, as published in the Calendar and

we will also now be able to go on Wednesday 20th February.

Congratulations to Mrs Batten who successfully passed her Initial Officers' Training course at RAF Cranwell before Christmas and she now becomes Plt Off Batten.
