### **APPLICATION**

When you feel that Ratcliffe College is a strong possible choice for your child, we would encourage you to complete the online application form.

### **APPLICATION FORM**

The Admissions Team will contact your child's current school for a reference, which will be considered alongside the assessment or examination.

### **ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS**

Entrance Examinations normally take place in the January or February, before the September your child is due to start with us.

### OFFER OF PLACE

We aim to inform you of the outcome of your application within two weeks of the assessment. An offer is made by letter from the Headmaster, accompanied by acceptance paperwork.

### ACCEPTANCE OF PLACE

On accepting the offer of a place, payment of your deposit along with final paperwork will secure your child's place.

### BURSARIES

As a Catholic School our aim is to help children who, under normal circumstances, would not be able to benefit from a Ratcliffe education. Bursaries are available for up to 80% of a student's School Fee and in exceptional circumstances up to 100%. All awards are subject to parental means testing. For those entering Years 7 or 12, bursaries are allocated

to Years 7 and 12 and may be awarded up to the value of 50% of the school fee.

### SCHOOL BUS SERVICE

The School currently operates four bus services bringing in students from a wide area. The precise route in each case is determined each year based on the demand from parents, with a rough guide being one route serving the South and East of Leicester, one route from the direction of Nottingham, one route covering the Charnwood villages and Loughborough, and one route through the Vale of Belvoir.

The route serving Leicester is operated by a third-party coach company whereas the other two routes utilise school minibuses with our own drivers.



Our aim is to have all students in School for 8.15am with a target first pick up time of around 7.20am.

Buses depart after the end of the extended school day at 6.20pm, to allow full participation in our extensive programme of extracurricular activities, and at 4.20pm, where there is sufficient demand.





# HOW TO FIND US

The College is easily accessible from all directions and benefits from being free of traffic congestion at peak times.

Situated in the East Midlands, on the A46 seven miles north of Leicester, close to the towns of Loughborough and Melton Mowbray and the city of Nottingham, Ratcliffe College is conveniently located for the national motorway network. Access by train is equally easy – the College is only 20 minutes from Leicester's railway station, with its regular services to London and the North. For air travellers, the M1 and M42 links bring both Birmingham (around one hour) and East Midlands (45 minutes) airports within easy reach, while London -Heathrow and London - Stansted are around 2½ hours away.





# VISIT US

### **OPEN MORNINGS**

Our twice-yearly Open Mornings take place during September and March each year, these public events are useful if you are looking to get a taste of the college, tour the grounds and speak to teachers. These events are relaxed and informal and provide the opportunity to ask any questions you might have and pick up any important information you might need.

### TASTER DAYS

Your child may wish to spend a Taster Day at Ratcliffe on a normal school day either prior to taking the Entrance Examination or Assessment or after being offered a place with us. We find this works very well in terms of each child becoming familiar with the school grounds and classrooms, the daily schedule, the content of lessons and how they are delivered, the personalities of teachers and children at the school and generally the overall culture of the school.





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
